THIRTY-THREE YEARS AGO! "NAGO OR "ANAGO."

I should communicate to the readers of Iwe Irohin the information I could gather on the word "Nago." The word "Nago" is a corrupt form of the Portuguese word "Negro." (English, Negro) It was first corrupted by the Popos or Egun people at the time of the slave trade. Negro is applied to a race of dark persons inhabiting the greater part of Africa. If "Nago" is a corrupt form of "Negro" it does not particularly belong to natives of Lagos. The mistake of applying "Nago" particularly to natives of Lagos exists not only here Sierra Leoneans generally think "Nago" is the name for the natives of Lagos. From this information, it is wrong to say you don't hear Nago;" that will be saying "you don't hear Negro. This information is open to correction.

ARE WE A NATION? BY A NATIVE OF ANEHO.

If the Missionary has done us any good, it is in teaching us literature and that we must appreciate. In this connection the German Missionary, above all others, deserves our sincere gratitude for his painstaking labour in reducing our language to writing. Go to any place where no German Missionary had laboured and there you will find that the people have no literature, or if they had any at all introduced by themselves it is in a state of chaos. This does not speak well, of our M.A.'s and B.A.'s and, perhaps, we may not blame them so much as they have only studied one language which after all does not confer the kind of education required which makes Japan what she is today. Is there any nation without a written language? Are ours the solitary nation which takes no pride in a language? No African should mislead himself that he can improve upon any of the existing European languages he has studied. If Western education has not the virtue of leading us in to a wider world, to meet with men and things we never heard of before, so as to be the more able to appreciate in a high degree our own civilisation, it will be just the same as the study of

Hausa for commercial purposes only. Now the European is incapable of mastering our language (as most Africans, do his) and he writes and pronounces our word contrary to our rules or idioms. Curiously enough, highly educated Africans lead their less educated brethren to follow the Europeans to mutilate their own language and make it so unintelligible, because the European pronounce or write it so. We are masters of our own language and it is our duty to make it remain genuine. But it is not only individual Europeans who mutilate and corrupt our languages, but Governments also. The Gold Coast Government is the greatest sinner in this respect. Ask them what is the official names for the following places, and you will find the justification of this criticism: Secondee, Secondi, Sekondi, or Sekonde; Coomasse, Coomasi, Kumasi, or Kumase; Quitah, Ketta, or Kwita, or Keta? We take the last for example "Ke" in Anlo means "sand" and "ta" is head top; then Keta means "Sandtop" how it becomes Quitah, Ketta Kwita baffles conjecture, but the black man must always follow the white man to do things in the wrong way, despite the excellent literature the Bremen Missionaries produced for the Anlo race. It may be characteristic of the Anlo people that they would follow the Europeans more in a higher degree than is the case with their neighbours. Hence an Anlo man or woman only salutes one another in English and never in their own language, or call themselves ridiculous biblical and European names the meaning of which they do not understand. Are we a nation without language, literature or names? As may be expected, Anecho is also in the middle and we follow the Germans by calling the place Anecho which has no meaning in Gè language. "Ane" is the Fanti word for west and "Ho," house. How the place becomes "Anecho" perplexes those whose ancestors first settled in it and by whom the place was named. What is in a name? There is much thing in a name as there is much in a language and literature. Do you ask what is in German, French or English literature? Don't you know it? There is something in Fanti, Ga, Gè or Anlo literature which must be preserved but not mutilated or corrupted. Whilst the Gold Coast Government was mutilating and corrupting African names of places, the Nigerian Government, or to be exact, the Northern Nigerian Government of the early days, was doing splendid work despite the fact that there were slight mistakes; hence we can with ease write such names as Ilorin, Zangera, Kaduna, Zaria, Kano and Sokoto. But if these places were situated in the Gold Coast we shall have to look for their Russian spellings. "Ilorin" "Zoongeroo," "Cadooner," "Zarree," "Canno" and "Socotto" will sound pretty Russian. But Nigeria is indebted to the first C.M.S. German

Missionaries who laid the foundation of the excellent Yoruba and other literatures as the Gold Coast is indebted to the Basel and Bremen Missionaries for the production of excellent literatures in their spheres of activity.—*Gold Coast Leader*, 6, 3, 22.
