ing well and is sure to improve the produce trade of our country. Its effect upon the quality of Cocoa is noticeable on all hands and both the traders and buyers are load in their praises

of the benefits conferred on trade. Of course, there is always "the other side" to a picture the illiterate farmers who had been accustomed to having things all in their own way are complaining of the extra labours required by the new restriction, which, after all, is in the interest of

produce industry

Hour brothers on the Gold Coast have. through proper care in preparing their Cozon for export been able to obtain the front place in the Cocoa industry, there is no reason why our people in Nigeria should not do the same. In fact we have sufficient proofs to show that this can easily be achieved by the quality of Cocoa produced by both the Agege and Ibadan Agricultural Societies. It was a member of the latter Society [the Hon. f) Sowemimo who won the Special Cocoa Prize at the last Ibadan Agricultural Show. Ife and Heta ranked next to Agega in the high grade cocoa coming from these places to the market, the result of systematic instructions to the farmers by the Agricultural Department.

We are convinced that the best safeguard necessary to keep up the present quality of cocoa is for the authorities to prohibit the transportation of raw, improperly cured cocoa beans by motor lorries to Einrin Market and Lagos and that every cocoa so loaded must have an

Inspection Certificate.

We congratulate the Agricultural Department for the success of their new Produce Regulation.
