#### YORUBA PHYSICS.

PREVENTIVE AND HEALING TREATMENTS.

A SCHEME of house intensition to the medical of, ficers is going on in the town at present. The principal objects of attack are, its romoured, the destruction of Mosquito Laves, the clearing of refuse and fifth from the houses and instruction on general sanitary methods to the immates of every compound inspected.

This new movement on the part of the government is commendable indeed, considering the prevalence of plague in one form or the other in the different portions of Nigeria, which has been the cause of the loss of many valueable lives to the country. Down in Lagos, where the
